

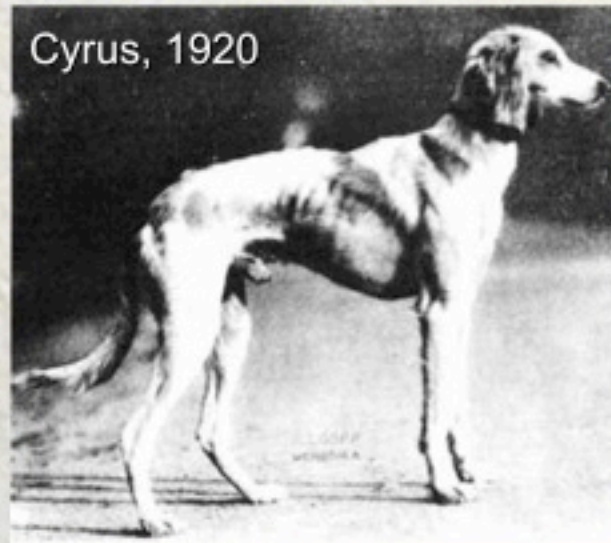

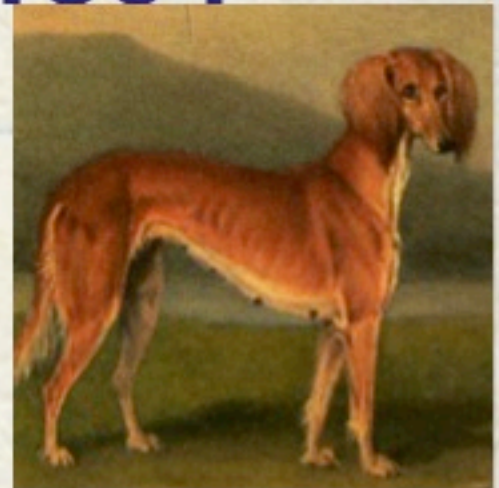

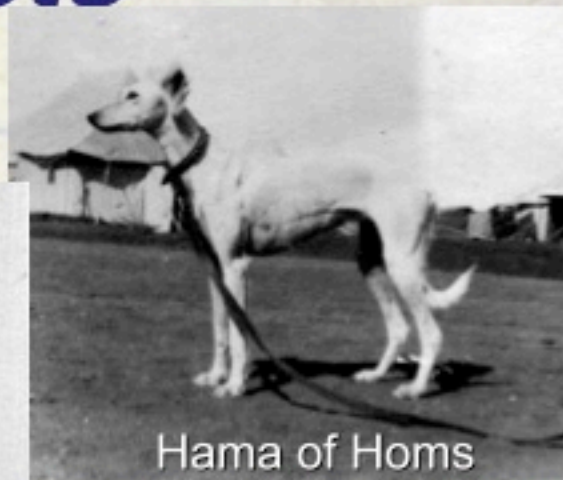
What Makes a “Significant” Desert Import?

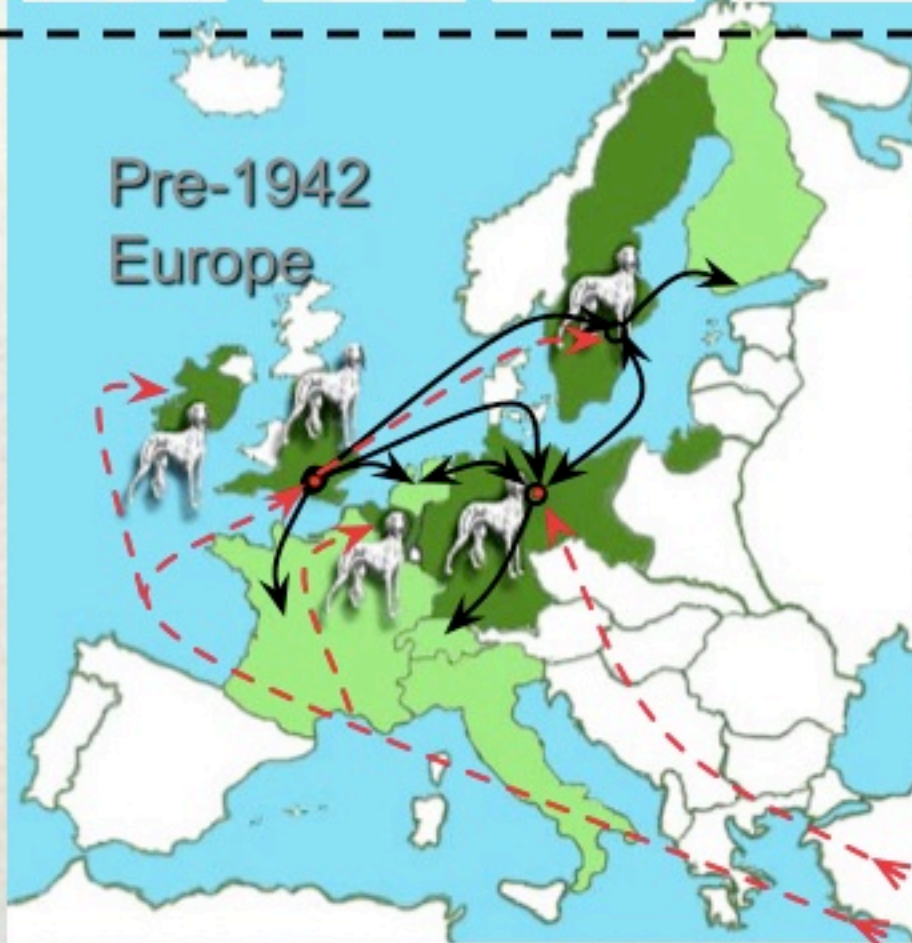

Registered Imports to Great Britain 1895 - 1946



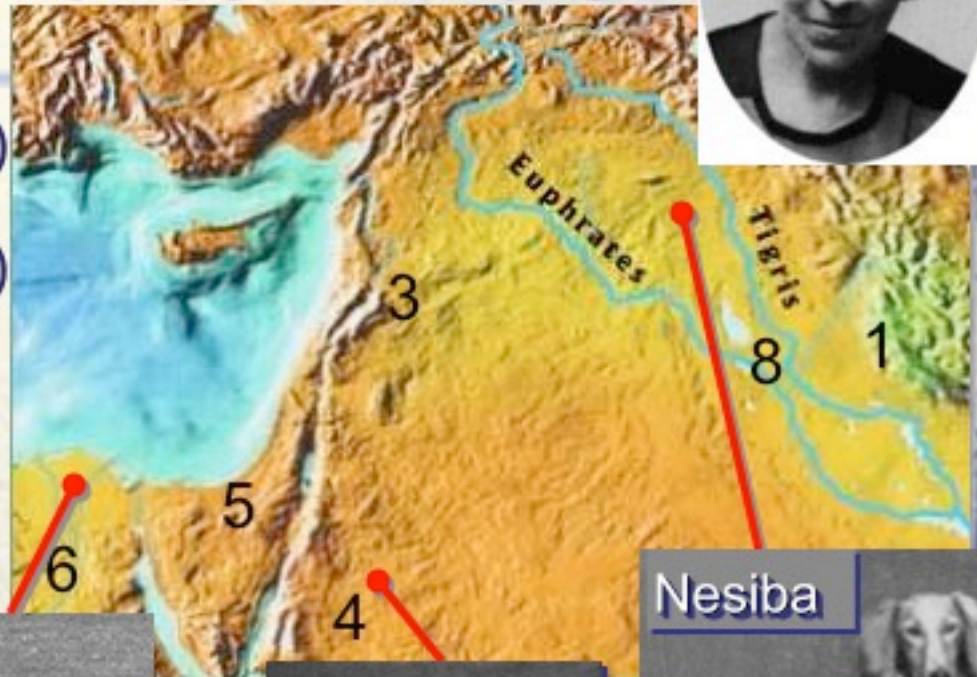

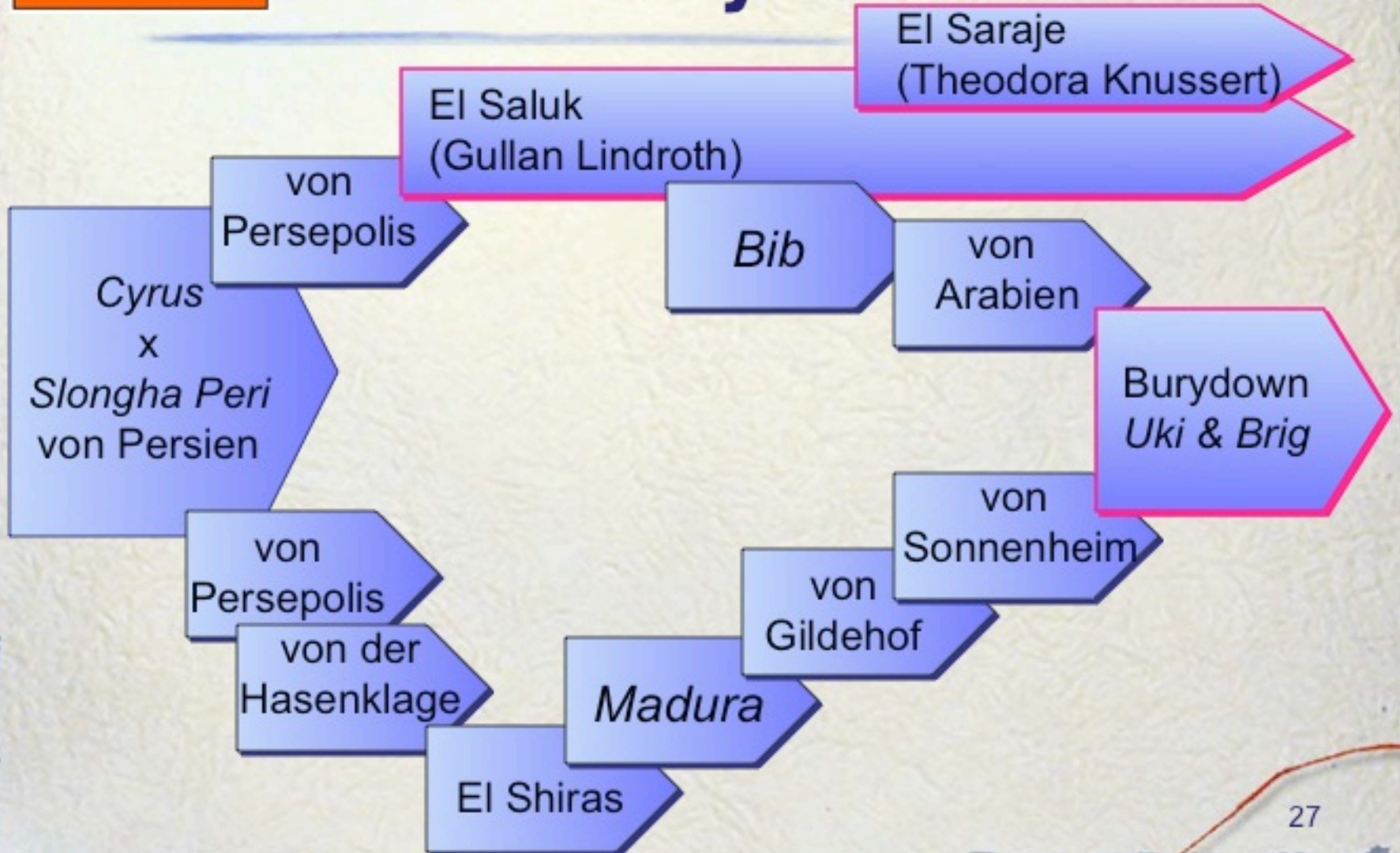

Immediately after the war it was nearly impossible to get food for our dogs. One day appeared in my apartment

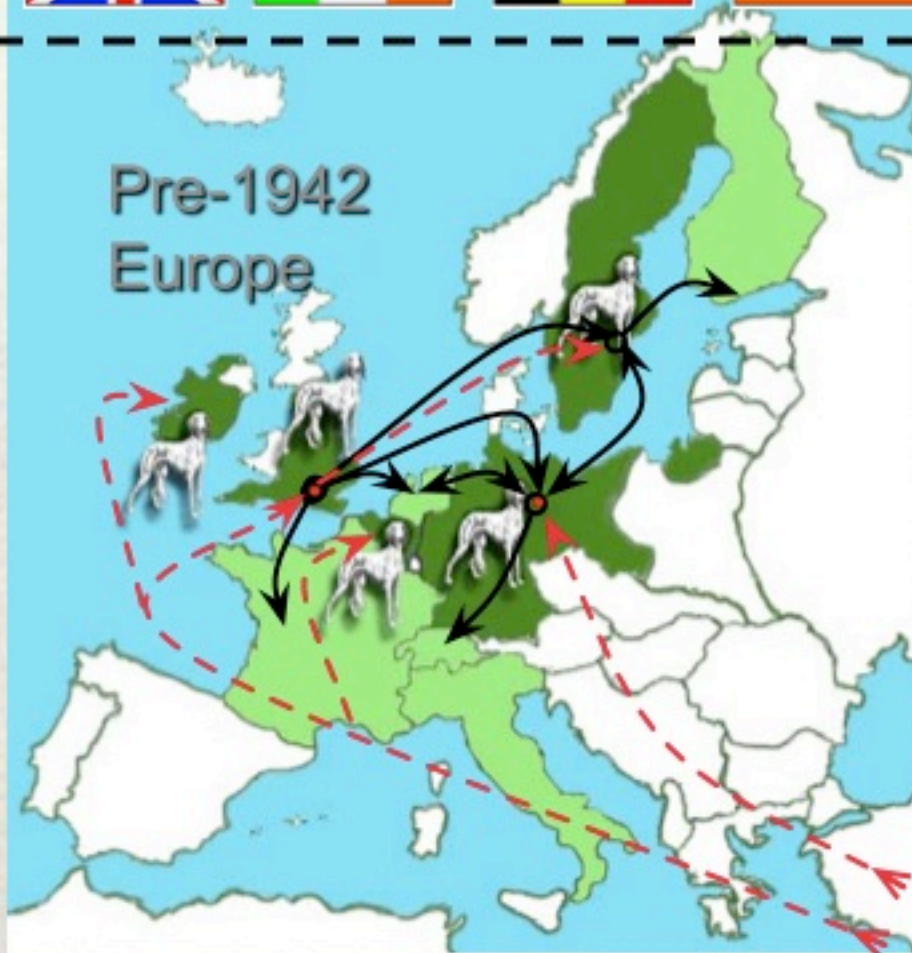

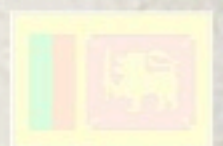
Post 1946 Populations

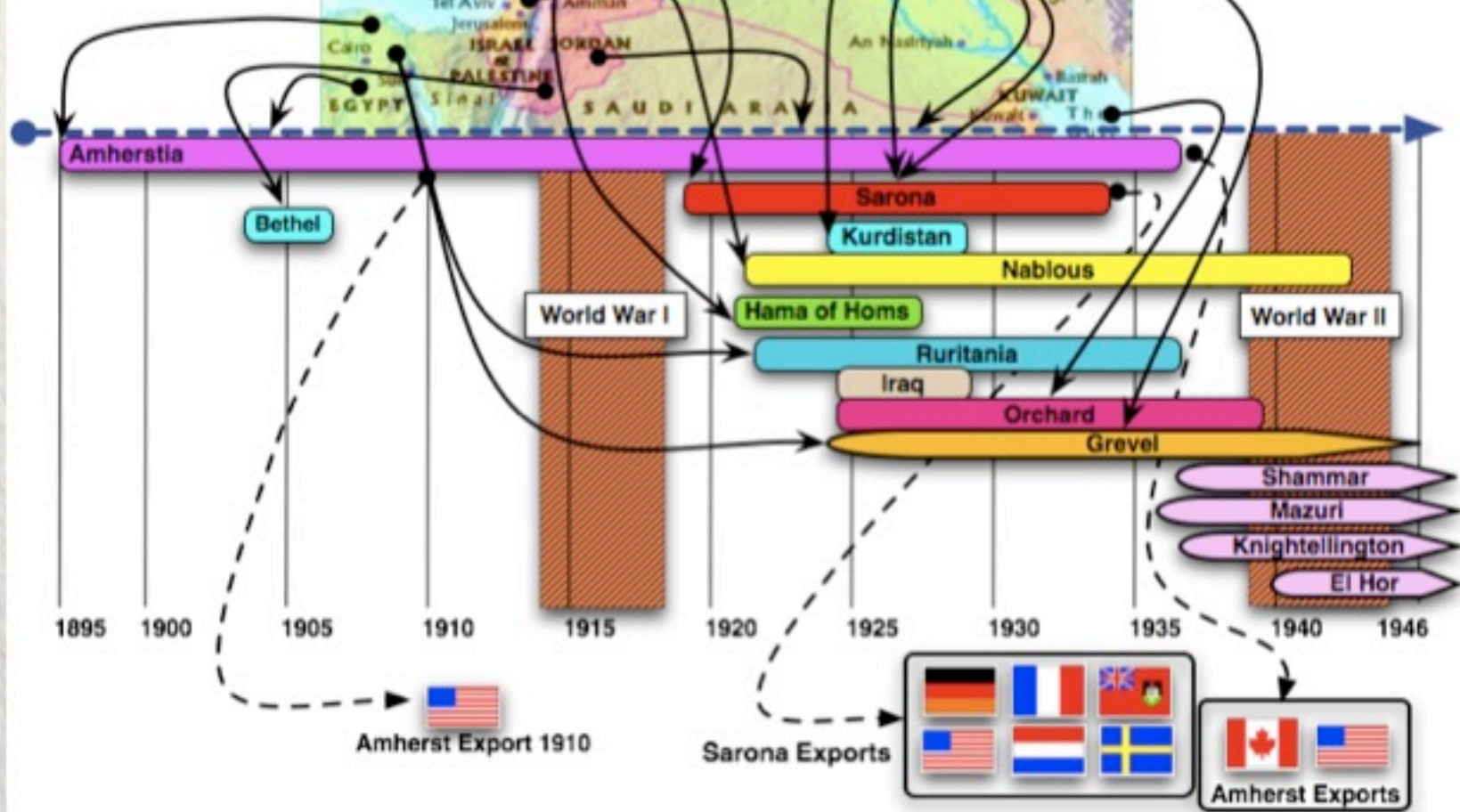


Early Iraqi Exports
